





What does economics mean?

- "the study of scarcity"
- "an orderly system of exchange: how people use resources and respond to incentives."
- "how we organize ourselves to sustain life and enhance its quality."

oikos

oy'-kos

word origin: derived from the Greek root of οίκεω (oikeō), meaning "to dwell" or "to inhabit."

definition: home or household i.e. that system of relationships that sustains us.

"In a gift economy, wealth is understood as having enough to share, and the practice for dealing with abundance is to give it away. . . . The currency in a gift economy is relationship, which is expressed as gratitude, as interdependence and the ongoing cycles of reciprocity. A gift economy nurtures the community bonds that enhance mutual well-being; the economic unit is 'we' rather than 'I,' as all flourishing is mutual."
